Recycling in a **CHANGING** Market

HOW HAS THE RECYCLING MARKET CHANGED?

The most significant change in the market is due to China's National Sword Policy. China used to be the largest consumer of America's recycled material, purchasing over 70 percent of materials collected. In 2018, China enacted the National Sword Policy which placed significant restrictions on the quality of imported recyclables. Consequently, this reduced, and in some parts of the country, eliminated, the demand for recycled materials. This came as a result of high contamination rates of imported recyclables. Contamination is any material that is not acceptable, as defined on page 5.

HOW ARE WE RESPONDING?

Our goal is to eliminate the contamination in our residential collection programs. Plastic bags, plastic film, and styrofoam containers from grocery stores are unacceptable in our public drop off bins. In addition, items such as electronics and household appliances, containing plastic, metal and/or glass should be taken to local processors. WHAT IS THE FUTURE OF RECYCLING?

Our mission remains the same: to keep waste materials out of local landfills. One of the critical aspects of this is to continue recycling by finding new markets and collecting a higher quality of recycled materials. Recycling is always going to play a critical role in our mission; however, the amount of materials will be determined by our ability to collect a clean stream of higher valued materials. 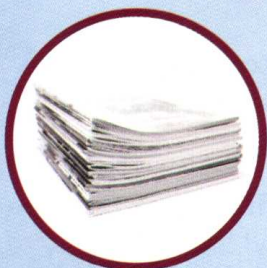

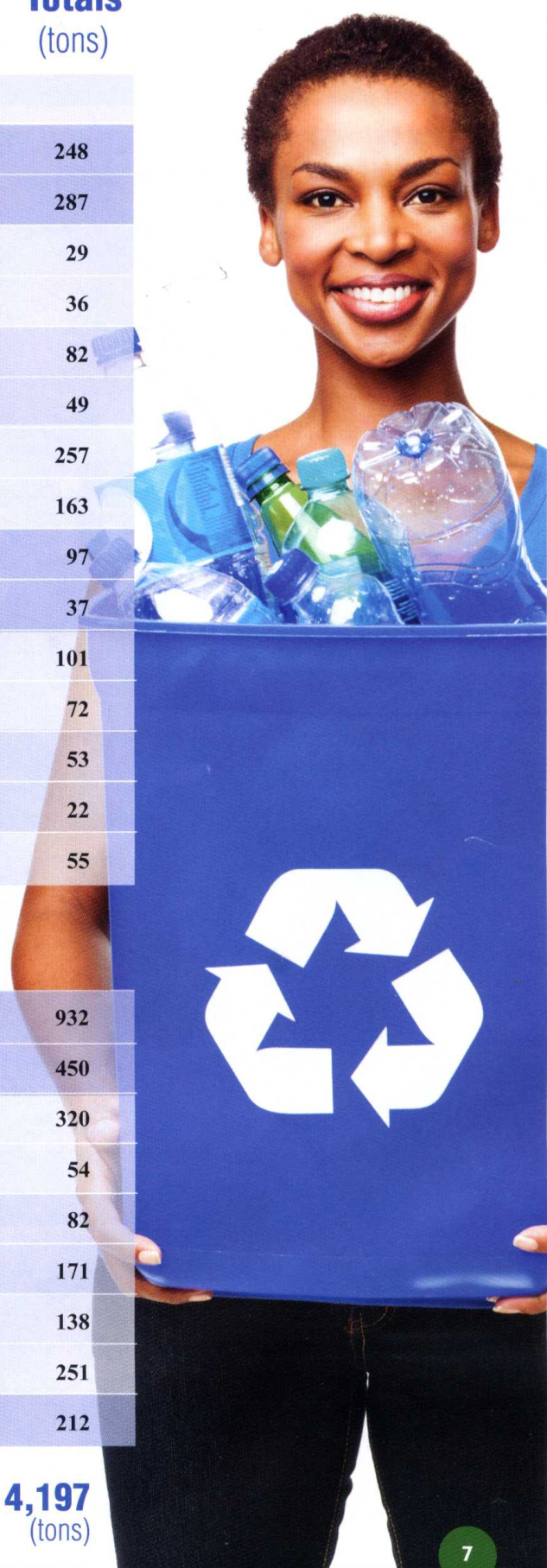
