Charles Warner, 406 Springbrook Dr. S.W., New Philadelphia, said he knows how difficult it is to put aside money to fund necessary projects, and he suggested that State Issue 1, recently passed, could help with the flooding problems throughout the city.

Nick Johnson, 1760 Baltzley Valley, New Philadelphia, said he is out of the city, but is also concerned about the Beaver Dam Creek flooding. He said he is aware that residents have not been contacted for easement rights over their property, and asked why Mr. Locker has stepped down from working on the project. Mr. Johnson said Mr. Locker has not stepped down from anything, and is still actively involved. Service Director Gary Espenschied said his Assistant Jim Zucal is working with the Law Director to have easements drawn up, and they are waiting for Gradall to have the equipment to begin the clean up. Gradall said they are very busy now, and will call when they are ready to begin.

Paul Mishler, 1006 3rd St. N.W., New Philadelphia, said this project just keeps getting pushed back. He said the city doesn't even have the paperwork ready. Mr. Espenschied said the city will begin on city owned property first, as they own some property on Ray Ave. Ext. Mr. Mishler thanked Main Street Director Pauline Wyrie for a job well done.

Ella Slough, 616 Sandpiper, S.E., New Philadelphia, asked why the trees on East High Avenue and University Drive were removed. Mr. Espenschied said the city had nothing to do with their removal. He said the corporation line is in and out there, and it was possible the property owner had them cut down for various reasons.

Bob Connor, 122 North Ave. NW, New Philadelphia, said he is unclear to the status of the paperwork for the easements for the Beaver Dam Creek cleaning. Mr. Espenschied said he is working on it.
